**UNRESOLVED RECOMMENDATIONS AS AT 20 JANUARY 2010**

<b>Date Passed</b>	<b>Resolution/Comment</b>
15 July 2004	<p><i>That the Waipa Heritage Council recommends to Waipa District Council that, as part of its Heritage Strategy development, it commissions someone to produce heritage overlays which would identify areas of the main towns (Cambridge, Te Awamutu, Kihikihi, Ohaupo and Pirongia) that were settled prior to 1900 with the implication that these are archaeological sites.</i></p> <p><b>Comment</b></p> <p>22 January 2009 - Proposed Plan Change will provide the opportunity to prepare detailed Heritage Maps. Consultation will commence from the end of February to June 2009. During this period, the Heritage Council will have full and adequate opportunity to advise on heritage requirements of the Waipa District.</p> <p>1 October 2009 – Detailed Heritage maps are being prepared as part of the District Plan review.</p>
17 March 2005 and 21 April 2005	<p><i>That possible locations for the restored Memorial Park Locomotive are Selwyn Park, in the vicinity of the Events Centre, the sculpture gardens on Albert Park Drive, outside Benchmark on Arawata Street and Memorial Park, Mutu Street (first grass verge &amp; placed back from the road).</i></p> <p><b>Comment</b></p> <p>22 January 2009 – Deferred until completion of the Locomotive’s restoration.</p> <p>1 October 2009 – The proposed Heritage and Cultural Centre, during public consultation and development of a design brief, is being investigated as a possible location for the locomotive.</p>
