### Armistice Civic Service Run Sheet

### **Purpose**

This paper supplements the Waipa District Council's Operations Plan for the Armistice Commemorative Services held in Cambridge on closest Sunday to Armistice Day (11 November) annually at the Cambridge Town Hall and provides guidance to those planning, administering, and implementing the various elements of the Event.

### Elements

There are four elements to the Event:

- 1. Planning (Community Board ANZAC and Armistice Remembrance Organising Committee)
- 2. Preparation (AM 10 November 2019)
- 3. Parade of Veterans/Service Personnel and military vehicles
- 4. Commemorative Service

### **Planning**

The Cambridge Community Board ANZAC and Armistice Remembrance Organising Committee usually meets fortnightly from mid-September to confirm planning and ensure oversight, coordination and if necessary, changes in the preparation, of all aspects of the Event. The Committee includes representatives of the key organisations — RSA, Waikato Mounted Rifles, Cambridge Brass Band, Cambridge and District Pipe Band, and others deemed necessary to the success of the Event.

These plans include arrangements for aspects controlled by Council e.g. flag poles, flags, sister city flag stand, road closures, public notices etc liaising with various internal and external agencies as required. The Event Planning Template contains details of these responsibilities.

- Ensure access for bands to set up
- 10 country flags collected from Council
- Arrange for Cricket Club picket fences (to define clear area around Cenotaph)
- Flags at half mast
- Wreaths delivered

- Caterers prepare Victoria Room
- Briefing and morning tea for VIPs, Escort Officers etc (Mike Pettit/Paul Murphy)



## Armistice Civic Service Wet Weather Run Sheet

The Committee includes representatives of the key organisations — RSA, Waikato Mounted Rifles, Cambridge Brass Band, Cambridge and District Pipe Band, and others deemed necessary to the success of the Event.

These plans include arrangements for aspects controlled by Council e.g. flag poles, flags, sister city flag stand, road closures, public notices etc liaising with various internal and external agencies as required. The Event Planning Template contains details of these responsibilities.

### Wet Weather

In case of wet weather, the following programme will be implemented.

- 1. The move to a wet weather routine will be called by **0830** on the morning of the ceremony (i.e. before the cadets have begun to set out seating and gazebos).
- 2. This call will automatically cancel the street parade and the need for the rolling road closure.
- 3. The ceremony will be held in the Cambridge Town Hall with seating arranged to conform as close as possible with the outdoor arrangements (see wet weather seating plan).
- 4. MC and Parade Commander will be at lecturn
- 5. Cambridge Brass Band will be seated on stage.
- 6. The front of the stage will become the symbolic cenotaph
- 7. The flags of the ten countries will be draped along the front of the stage (5 either side of the steps), 3 poppy banners will be hung at the rear of the stage, the 2 LQ banners will be on either side of the stage.
- 8. The Catafalque Guard will muster in the dressing room passageway at the rear of the stage and march on from either side (2 each) to take post along the front of the stage facing inwards towards the stairs. Guard Commander at top of stairs facing the band.

### Order of Service

Because some elements featuring the Cadets are no longer relevant, the Service will **start slightly later at 1010** (in order to try and coincide with 1100 bells etc)


