- 1. This Minute addresses the hearing of submissions and further submissions on Proposed Plan Change 17 to the Operative Waipā District Plan.

- 4. The Hearings Panel sets the following timetable orders for the filing of the s42A Report, evidence and legal submissions for the hearing:
 - (a) The s42A Report, including supporting reports and evidence, is to be filed by 4pm on Monday, 27 February 2023;
 - (b) Submitter expert evidence is to be filed by 4pm on Monday, 13 March 2023;
 - (c) Submitter lay evidence and any expert rebuttal evidence is to be filed by 4pm on Friday, 17 March 2023; and
 - (d) All legal submissions are to be filed by 4pm on Friday 24 March 2023.
- 5. Council is to circulate all documents to all parties on receipt and load all documents on Council's PC17 web page as soon as practicable after receipt.
- 6. All documents filed in accordance with this direction will be taken as read by the Hearings Panel.
- 7. The hearing is scheduled to commence on Wednesday, 29 March 2023.
 - (a) Any preliminary matters raised in legal submissions filed the previous week will be heard at the outset; the Hearings Panel may choose to reserve its position on any

- preliminary matter raised before proceeding to hear evidence and legal submissions on substantive matters; and
- (b) Counsel can address 'late-breaking events' by way of addendum to their legal submissions tabled at the hearing.
