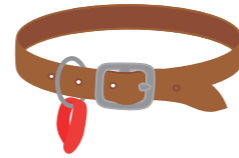

Animal Control Services

We offer a 24-hour dog and stock control service.

9am to 5pm – customer support staff are available to take calls.

5pm to 9am weekdays, weekends, and public holidays – after hours staff are available to deal with urgent incidents.

Dog Exercise Areas

Some dog exercise areas around the district have a mix of on-leash and off-leash times. In these areas:

During Daylight saving time, dogs are allowed off-leash from 6pm-10am (but on-leash from 10am-6pm).

During Winter time, dogs are allowed off-leash from 3pm-10am (but on-leash from 10am-3pm).

Dog exercise and prohibited areas

Key

-  Dogs are prohibited at all times.
-  Dogs are prohibited from playgrounds at all times.
-  Dogs are allowed off-leash at all times.

In other public areas, the general rule is that dogs need to be on-leash at all times.
