- If approval is given to remove or work within the dripline of a council tree it is subject to approval of all other council approvals required for the work outlined in the request (e.g. approval of a vehicle entrance being applied for in conjunction with this application).
- Unauthorised people are not permitted to prune or remove any street or park tree without Council's prior consent.
- Penalties may be imposed for pruning or removing a Council tree without permission.
- Requests for tree removal will be considered by the Community Services team and assessed against council's tree policy; it will need to meet one or more of the criteria for removal.
- If a tree removal is approved the cost of removal and all associated costs are to be paid by the applicant.
- All relevant legislation relating to the removal of the tree and any other requirements must be met by the applicant, including health and safety, traffic management, ecological



requirements (e.g. monitoring for and protecting critically endangered long tailed bats if they could be present in the tree).

Root protection zone definition

'Root protection zone'

means for a tree with a spreading canopy, the area beneath the canopy spread of a tree, measured at GROUND LEVEL from the surface of the trunk, with a radius to the outer most extent of the spread of the tree's branches, and for a columnar tree, means the area beneath the canopy extending to a radius half the height of the tree. As demonstrated by the diagrams below.
