REQUIREMENTS FOR KEEPING MORE THAN TWO DOGS ON URBAN LAND WITHIN THE WAIPA DISTRICT

The Waipa District Council Dog Control Bylaw 2015 Clause 3.4.1 states:

3.4.1. No occupier of any land within the urban areas specified in Schedule 3 shall allow to remain, or keep on the land for a period exceeding 14 days, more than 2 dogs in total at any one time (which exceed 3 months of age), unless the occupier is the holder of a permit issued by the Council or a Delegated Officer.

REQUIREMENTS FOR OBTAINING A PERMIT

- The applicant/owner will take responsibility for ensuring there are no covenants on the Certificate of Title, pertaining to the keeping of dogs, which limit the number or exclude the keeping of dogs on this property.
- The applicant/owner must have a good record of dog control i.e. no substantiated complaints or impoundings over the last two years.
- All dogs must be registered and owners must comply with all requirements of the Dog Control Act 1996, Waipa District Dog Control Bylaw 2015 and meet or exceed the minimum standards of welfare as provided in the Animal Welfare (Dogs) Code of Welfare 2010.
- All movements of dogs to and from your property (dogs sold, died or change of ownership) <u>must</u> be notified to the Council within 14 days. Replacement dogs of a similar breed/type may be allowed to continue under the existing permit at the discretion of the Animal Control Officer. Failure to advise of changes may result in the permit being cancelled, and another permit application required.
- If dogs are to be housed outdoors, the kennels and runs are to be situated on a paved area that is impervious and able to be easily cleaned. The kennel and yard area shall be kept clean and hygienic at all times (daily cleaning required).
- Kennels must be no closer than three metres from any boundary and situated so as not to cause a nuisance to occupants of neighbouring properties.
- Should any intended kennel building exceed 10m², a building consent may be required from Waipa District Council before work proceeds. Contact Council's building control department for further information/advice.
- The dogs shall be provided with a constant supply of clean drinking water.
- Owners must provide regular and adequate parasite prevention treatments (fleas, worms, flies).
- Dogs must be adequately exercised off the property daily.
- The application fee is not refundable if the application is unsuccessful.
- Where approval is granted, this will normally be for three years, however Council reserves the right at any time, to revoke or amend approval should any of the requirements/conditions be breached.

 All above requirements must be completed at time of application. If your property is not up to the required standard at the time of our inspection, any extra inspection may incur an additional fee per further inspection

Permit Conditions:

In addition to the above, Council may impose such reasonable conditions as required.
